

On April 8, 2011, the Japanese Red Cross Society announced “how to distribute the donations” to the victims – the first round distribution.

1. Donations received by the Japanese Red Cross. **EJCA’s donation directly sent to the Japanese Red Cross Society will be in this category.**

According to a decision by the “Delivery Committee”, the donations will be distributed:

- ✧ The houses broken, burned, or gone, people died or missed - 350,000 yen (about \$4,000)
- ✧ The houses half broken or half burned – 180,000 yen (about \$2,000)
- ✧ Families within 30 km from the nuclear power plants - \$350,000 yen (about \$4,000)

The Japanese Red Cross Society will send the fund to each prefecture when it receives a request from each prefecture using the above figures.

2. Donations received by the Japanese Red Cross from the overseas Red Cross Societies. **EJCA’s donation sent to the Canadian Red Cross will be in this category.**

As a life support activity, the Japanese Red Cross society will purchase electronic appliances for 70,000 temporarily housing units being built at Iwate, Miyagi, and Fukushima prefectures.

On April 8, 2011, the first 36 families moved in to temporarily housing units that were built at the school ground of the Rikuzen Takada Junior High School. The families received a fridge, a microwave oven, a rice cooker, a TV set, an electronic pot, and a washing machine.
